Sermon Series: The Power of Love

2/23/25 "The World," Luke 19:1-11 (1-10), MEV

INTRODUCTION If we are to sacrifice for believers, how are we to love unbelievers?

Jesus: new command (John 13:34-35) given 1 time in bible, but 8-9 times: love our neighbors (those outside church) as we love ourselves, beginning Leviticus 19:18, affirmed by Jesus in Matthew.

Matthew 22:36-39, NLT: 36 "Teacher, which is the most important commandment in the law of Moses?" 37 Jesus replied, "You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' 38 This is the first and greatest commandment. 39 A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'

What does loving our neighbor look like?

Luke 10:36-37, MEV: 36 "Now which of these three do you think was a neighbor to him who fell among the thieves?" 37 He said, "The one who showed <u>mercy</u> on him." Then Jesus aid to him, "Go and do likewise."

Matthew 7:12, NLT: "Do to others whatever you would like them to do to you.

What would we most want from someone? Truth about life & death?

MAIN IDEA: Love our neighbors as we do ourselves. How? Here are four things to do.

I. First, come to our neighbors.

- A. people in our lives: neighbors, co-workers, classmates, friends, family
- B. intentionally to build relationship in which we know each other, can talk
- C. help them when we see a need

ILLUSTRATION: Jesus came to earth...cookies at Christmas, this Easter

II. Second, expose them to Jesus (1-3)

A. show them His love...mercy, kindness, grace, gentleness

1. pray for them

2. offer to pray with them as opportunity arises

B. tell them what Jesus has done for you (witness)

Acts 1:8, NLT: But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And <u>you will be my witnesses</u>, telling people about me everywhere—<u>in Jerusalem</u>, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

ILLUSTRATION: Jesus healed, walked among them...postal truck

III. Third, seek those who are open *like Zacchaeus*

Seek: to look for, search after

A. those who are curious

B. those who are hurting and want help

C. can tell when the "window is open"

- 1. interested in hearing
- 2. might ask questions

ILLUSTRATION: P/S witnessed to many vs. later window open

IV. Finally, share His offer with them

Lost: those who will be "destroyed" or "killed" (Mounce)

Save (sozo): to deliver or protect or rescue; to heal; to make whole

A. tell those interested what He has done for us: *He died for us (Romans 5:8), rose again, offers life (Romans 10:9)*

- B. ask if they would like to begin a relationship with Him
- C. tell them they need only believe, surrender, talk with Him
- D. assure them He loves them & will hear them
- ILLUSTRATION: Bruce, Kevin, Chris, Uncle Jim

CONCLUSION: commanded to love our neighbor... are we doing so? Chris: I was never told; I wish I'd known

Dr. Joseph Parker: "Seize the fleeting chance; where there is a man that you can only see today, for he will be gone tomorrow, do good to him." "Only diamond cuts diamond; but the hardest heart, if cut at all, can be cut only by the tenderest."

ALTAR: Repent of not loving neighbor? Fear of doing so? Commit to doing so?
