New Sermon Series: Money: Friend or Foe?

4/27/25 "Mammon," Matthew 6:19-33, MEV

INTRODUCTION

Master: *kurios* = supreme in authority; God, Lord; owner of a person or thing

Serve: *duleo* = be devoted to

Mammon: portrayal of riches as an evil spirit or deity; "Bible versions...would probably best leave the word as Mammon, because it carries more than the material significance of money in its meaning—a potential master; thus having great spiritual consequence." *—Hayford, Bible Handbook*

MAIN IDEA: Let us continually examine ourselves to know which god we serve. How? Here are three questions to ask.

I. First, where do I store my treasures? (19-21)

- A. on earth
 - 1. material things I treasure, long for, try to store up, rely upon, place my hope in
 - 2. influence, success (make ourselves god)—both of which we often measure by wealth & possessions
 - 3. all earthly treasures are vulnerable and will perish
- B. in Heaven (God's Presence)
 - 1. God-given treasure we gain through obedience to Jesus, following Him, serving His purposes
 - 2. only that which we do for Jesus will last forever

ILLUSTRATION: tombs of pharaohs still have riches—cannot go with us to next life

II. Second, what do I set my sights on? (22-23)

A. the things of God

- 1. loving, serving, obeying, following God, fulfilling His purposes
- 2. allowing me to see clearly
- 3. allowing the Spirit to flow in & through me

B. the things of this world

1. loving, serving the things of this world, following this world's leading—going along with the world's values, attitudes, behaviors

1John 2:15, MEV: If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

- 2. prohibiting my ability to see clearly & understand truth, reality, right priorities, to recognize temptations
- 3. placing me in bondage, darkness

III. Third, where do I find my security? (25-34)

- A. in my earthly things
 - 1. creates a false sense of security... revealed by death, terminal diagnosis, natural disaster...
 - 2. often the more I have, the more I think I need...
- B. in God (32-33)
 - 1. He wants me to *seek first His kingdom, His righteousness*...yes, work, but put Him first
 - 2. He'll meet my needs
- C. easy to convince ourselves that we trust God while we really trust ourselves or others to provide for us

1. we are called to work

Ephesians 4:28, Sam's paraphrase: work so that you have something to share with those in need

2Thess. 3:10, NLT: "Those unwilling to work will not get to eat."

2. work can become a god: success, security, identity
