Chosen

Do you remember how when you were a child in gym class, teams were picked by a team captain pointing out people one at a time? In my illustrious early career as an athlete, I was chosen last or next to last pretty much every time until a new classmate became a friend and began choosing me earlier.

Some of us feel in our lives as though we are still being picked last. While we are not being chosen for a sports team, that feeling of rejection and shame hangs on us. We approach every new situation with a mindset that we are somehow unworthy. We anticipate not seeing any more donuts, receiving the smallest piece of pizza, having to eat all of the cabbage and carrots that remain in the salad bowl.

But I have good news for you, my friend: You *are* chosen, if you have received Christ as your Lord and Savior. You are a child of God, whom God chose before the foundation of the world (Ephesians 1:4). Yes, He looked down through time, saw you, and *chose you*.

Some will say, "Well God chooses everyone." That could not be more wrong. While He creates every person, those who actually love Him and follow Him—who are chosen—are very few (Matthew 7:13-14).

Not only has God chosen you, but He has called you *special* and made you a *royal*

priest (1Peter 2:9-10). Do you hear that? You are *royalty*. And you are a *priest*—part of the royal priesthood that serves Jesus.

The next time the thoughts come that somehow you were created less than wonderful or that all of creation sees you as less than desirable, look at yourself in the mirror and say this: "I have been chosen by God Almighty, and He has made me a member of His royal priesthood. He calls me *special*."

And when the enemy comes around and whispers, "Loser. You'll always be last," say to him, "I am chosen by God to be a royal priest for Jesus!"

The other family here has a 2-year-old boy that our girls have loved getting to play with.


We found a new home and moved in shortly after arriving! The home is unique as it has been lived in by

other believers for decades. The landlord knew that we were searching for a new home, and he called us to see if we wanted to move in! It's been such a neat thing moving into a home that has been covered in prayer for years and years. We have a beautiful garden, lots of outdoor space for our girls to play, and plenty of space to host our team as well as visiting groups. We're all very happy with our new home.

There has been a door open to work alongside a local church leader. They asked if we could host their weekly church gathering each Sunday, and we've been doing that since February. It's a small group of believers. Usually, it's anywhere between 2 and 4 people that attend each week. A local guy leads the group, and we are just there to support him! The men go out together weekly for Bible study and encouragement with other men who are new believers.

My wife also meets with 2 ladies on our team who have also been hosting a weekly Bible study with a few local ladies.

Right now, it's just 2 local girls coming, but we are praying that this little group would grow, not only in quantity but in depth of their love for Jesus! She and the girls also befriended a young lady who works at a shop in our neighborhood. She tries to stop by and see her at least once a week. She has been able to share several Bible stories with her. After sharing the Easter story with her, the airl asked if she could read it somewhere. She sent her the whole story from the

While overall church attendance In Great Britain is in decline, people are flocking to Catholic and Pentecostal churches.
Reports also show that church attendance for people ages 18-33 has more than doubled since 2018. They are calling it a "quiet revival."

At the AG Great Britain in May 2025, we celebrated 10 new church plants in 3 years. Our 6-year goal is 400 churches. Pray for the XM team and the new training and strategic systems that need to be put into place to accelerate our efforts. church! Every year, I am privileged to serve at Camp Agaiutim Nune, The Place of God, near Emmonak, AK.

Camp A.N. is located in remote western Alaska, in the Lower Yukon delta.

Spirit and many donors throughout the country. Electricity is provided with the camp's diesel generator. Such amenities as running water or sewer.

telephones, stores, or any other conveniences are not available in the area. All our supplies (including drinking water) and equipment are shipped from Anchorage into the village of Emmonak then taken by boat

the last 17 miles to the campsite. Our only neighbors are a handful of fish camps and the wildlife in the area.



camp began, we completed a second dorm for the boys. And this year, for the first few days of camp, it also snowed.

Morning chapel and evening services are distinctly marked by God's presence through worship,

singing, God's Word and the time around God's altar. Several young adults have come through Kid's Camps, Teen Camps, and Teen Discipleship Camps and today are leading ministry in youth groups in Alaska's villages.

During the week, the kids and teens also participate in activities, crafts, recreation, and hanging out at the "Moose Canteen." Every day is aimed to help them learn there is a God in heaven that loves them and wants a personal relationship with them.

The last night of Teen Camp is a special service called Family Camp. Families come from the local villages to enjoy the presence of God and Christian fellowship. The songs vary from

the traditional Yupik language to English. Many testimonies are shared and there is always a powerful time of ministry of the Word of God and at the altar afterward.
